



LEADERSHIP MEMPHIS TO RECEIVE TENNESSEE CENTER FOR PERFORMANCE EXCELLENCE COMMITMENT AWARD

Leadership Memphis has earned the Commitment Award in the annual Excellence in Tennessee recognition program administered by the Tennessee Center for Performance Excellence (TNCPE). TNCPE is Tennessee's only statewide quality program and is patterned on the Baldrige Performance Excellence Program, the national standard for recognizing role model performance through innovation, improvement, and visionary leadership. Leadership Memphis will accept the award at the 25th Annual Excellence in Tennessee Awards Banquet on February 21, 2018, at the Franklin Marriott Cool Springs.

Leadership Memphis: Empowering our community to STEP UP!

Through an annual evaluation and assessment process, TNCPE recognizes high-performing organizations that demonstrate continuous improvement and role model processes. This year, TNCPE has named 31 organizations as 2017 Award winners that represent outstanding achievement in the following industry sectors: health care, manufacturing, service, education, government, and nonprofit.

"Organizations that pursue a TNCPE award have a special drive," Gov. Bill Haslam said. Leadership Memphis' commitment to improvement will reach deep into our community, making a significant contribution to the state's economy, and the wellbeing of its citizens."

Organizations apply to the TNCPE program at one of four levels. As the levels increase, so does the depth and complexity of the application, which is based on the Baldrige Excellence FrameworkTM. Since the program was founded in 1993, only 24 organizations have attained the excellence designation. One will receive the Excellence Award this year; five organizations will be honored with the Achievement Award; 24 organizations will receive a Commitment Award; and one will receive Interest Recognition.

Commitment Awards are presented to organizations that are beginning to demonstrate serious commitment to, and implementation of, performance improvement principles. They have demonstrated progress by identifying and putting in place a measurement system to capture data and analyze results, and some key process improvements, which are directly attributable to a fact-based improvement process. Special thanks to Donn Fisher, EP'98, Executive Director/CEO, Mid-South Quality Productivity Center, and his team, for the guidance and encouragement he provided throughout the TNCPE Quality Award application process.

"The TNCPE Awards program helps organizations look at the big picture and continuously strive to implement the best practices in their industry or sector," said TNCPE president Katie Rawls. "But it's not easy – if it were, every organization in the state would be participating. Our 2017 award winners are truly passionate about performance excellence and have chosen TNCPE and the Baldrige framework to help them become the best they can be."

Plant The Parkways



COMING SPRING 2018

Volunteer Memphis, an action initiative of Leadership Memphis, in partnership with Memphis City Beautiful, is the recipient of a \$225,000 KRESGE Foundation grant for Plant the Parkways. And while the most visible aspect of the grant will be planting new trees to replenish the existing Parkway System, an equally important part of the grant involves engaging the community in the process in a way that promotes inclusiveness.

Currently, more than a dozen trained volunteers will inventory every tree within the medians of the 11.3 mile Parkway System. Plant the Parkways will focus on the 8.5 miles of parkway medians. Those conducting the inventory will provide invaluable information for the

project consultant, Ritchie Smith Associates Landscape Architects, such as the size, varietal type, and condition of each existing tree. Many of the volunteers are members of the City of Memphis Tree Board. In the weeks ahead a series of community meetings will be held to discuss Plant the Parkways and to seek input on the project, identify individuals, neighborhood organizations and institutional stakeholders who want to be involved in the project, enlist volunteers to work on the project and determine options for long-term sustainability for the Parkway System.

Walking the Parkway System during December is part of the final pre-planning phase of Plant the Parkways. GIS mapping, creating 23 detailed base maps, and understanding which trees are best suited for the project have consumed months of preparation. Preparation is expected to move to action by early spring when the planting phase of Plant the Parkways is projected to begin.

Andrea Hill, director of Volunteer Memphis, will follow up as work begins in organizing the community meetings.

The Parkway System is considered park land and is under the City of Memphis Division of Parks and Neighborhood Services. The Parkways, designed by renowned landscape architect George Kessler and created in the early 1900's, frame the center city, which contains more than 225,000 residents and intersects ten zip codes.
